ATTENTION: This funding opportunity is for grant funding that the Montana Board of Crime Control (MBCC) administers that originates from the United States Department of Health and Human Services (USHHS). To continue program activities designed to maintain public safety services, MBCC has determined that it will proceed with this funding opportunity. MBCC anticipates that new grant guidance may be issued in 2026 to reflect USHHS's revised policies and priorities. New USHHS guidance could change the terms and conditions and the availability of funding for any grants that are executed from this funding opportunity. MBCC will share new grant conditions, guidance, and requirements with all grantees as they become available. In some instances, executed grant awards may be revised or cancelled.

Q1: Page 15-16 of the application references the required reports and notes that quarterly reports are due on the 15th of July, October, January and April. It does not reference the historically required semi-annual reports that are due in April and in October. Will these reports also be required?

A1: Yes, the Federal FVPSA Bi-Annual and Annual reports are still required. FVPSA Bi-Annual Report Due April 30th – FVPSA Annual Report due October 31st.

Q2: Both the Civil Rights training and the EEO Reporting Tool are still unavailable. Should grantees include a screenshot in our application showing that these tools are unavailable?

A2: Yes, per the application. If the tool is not available, submit a screenshot of the website in place of the completed certificate.
