

Questions and Answers Byrne State Crisis Intervention Program (Byrne SCIP) / Sept Local Pass Through (Less than \$10,000 Jurisdictions)

Q1: Is this funding opportunity more suited for small projects or large projects (small budgets/large budgets)?

A1: It may be suited for large or small projects; keeping mindful when determining the amount of funds requested: the amount of funds applied for must be realistic, and that other applicants will be applying as well.

Q2: We're looking at a youth mental health project that is in schools, bringing people into local schools to provide mental health programming for teenagers. Making connections between gun violence and suicide prevention. Is that an allowable use of Byrne SCIP funds?

A2: Pending the application content, it appears to be an allowable use of Byrne SCIP funds.

Q3: Should projects hit all the priorities? Or can they hit just one of the goals?

A3: Depending upon the project scope, projects may hit all, or only one of the goals.

Q4: Are non-profits eligible to apply for this funding opportunity?

A4: No, non-profits are <u>NOT eligible</u> to apply for this funding opportunity. Non-profits may apply for the <u>Byrne State Crisis Intervention Program (Byrne SCIP) 60% State Share</u> funding opportunity.

Q5: My question was that I am trying to bring a high end top tier law enforcement active shooter training through the grant. Where would I list that breakdown of costs since it is a training. There did not appear to be a proper location for it.

A5: If your agency is contracting with an outside trainer to do the training, the costs breakdown should be listed under "Contracted Services".
